Green Tomelloso:

Guide to Parks, Walks and Nature Trails

Tomelloso is much more than vineyards and wineries: its network of urban parks, historic walks and rural routes make it an ideal destination for those seeking to reconnect with nature in an accessible, educational and peaceful way. From lush gardens in the heart of the city to rural paths among vineyards, the city offers green tourism combining culture, relaxation and discovery.



ALL THE INFO ABOUT GREEN AREAS

Urban parks and iconic promenades

Constitución Park
Don Antonio Huertas Avenue s/n
Covering an area of 51,000 m² and featuring an impressive grove of trees, including exotic palm trees such as Brahea Armata, this park combines play areas, refreshing fountains and perfect spots for reading or relaxing.

Martínez Urban Park
Next to Calle Socuéllamos 102
The oldest and most emblematic green space in Tomelloso, with 37,600 m² of vegetation, fountains and a bandstand for concerts. Its 700-metre-long promenade makes it the perfect place for a family walk.

Ramón Ugena Promenade and San Isidro Promenade
Two adjacent spaces welcoming visitors from the south, with pergolas, fountains and large shaded areas for peaceful strolls.

La Paz Park
Next to Calle Asturias
An example of careful landscaping, with native species such as junipers and cypresses, ideal for discovering the flora of La Mancha.

Embajadores Park
Next to Calle Guarnicioneros
Small and modern (2,500 m²), it stands out for its grasshopper-shaped slide, designed for younger children.

House of Arts and Letters
Calle San Antonio, 2
A garden blending nature and ethnography, with restored elements from an old rural winery, such as earthenware jars and a waterwheel, integrated into a signposted trail.

Historias de Plinio Park
Next to Calle Antonio López García 10
Themed space with sculptures, seasonal vegetation and literary references to García Pavón and his character Plinio.

Ciudad de Lepe Park
Next to Juan Carlos I Avenue, 101
Dedicated to the city of Huelva, it includes a fishing boat donated in honour of the twinning, creating a unique image on the plains of La Mancha.

Glorieta María Cristina Gardens
Next to the López Torres Museum
Anteroom of the López Torres Museum, with climbing roses, palm trees and ornamental shrubs.

Las Morenas Promenade
Next to Calle de Don Víctor Peñasco
A historic tree-lined promenade which, although today it features Spanish plane trees, preserves the memory of the original mulberry trees.

Virgen de las Viñas Park
Junto a Calle de Cirilo Villena 13
A unique space due to its small groups of birch, pear and cedar trees, which add height and colour to the landscape.

Other parks
Other green spaces in the city include Europa Park, Ínsula Barataria Park and New Tomelloso Gardens.

Green routes and natural surroundings

Bombos Route (PR CR 50)

A 17 km circular route through vineyards, dotted with traditional dry stone buildings. It starts at the Sanctuary of the Virgin of the Vineyards and is perfect for hiking or cycling.

Pinares de Pinilla Trail

Just 4 km from the centre, this spot combines a small pine forest with the hermitage of the Virgin of the Vineyards, ideal for walking, picnicking or admiring the local flora.

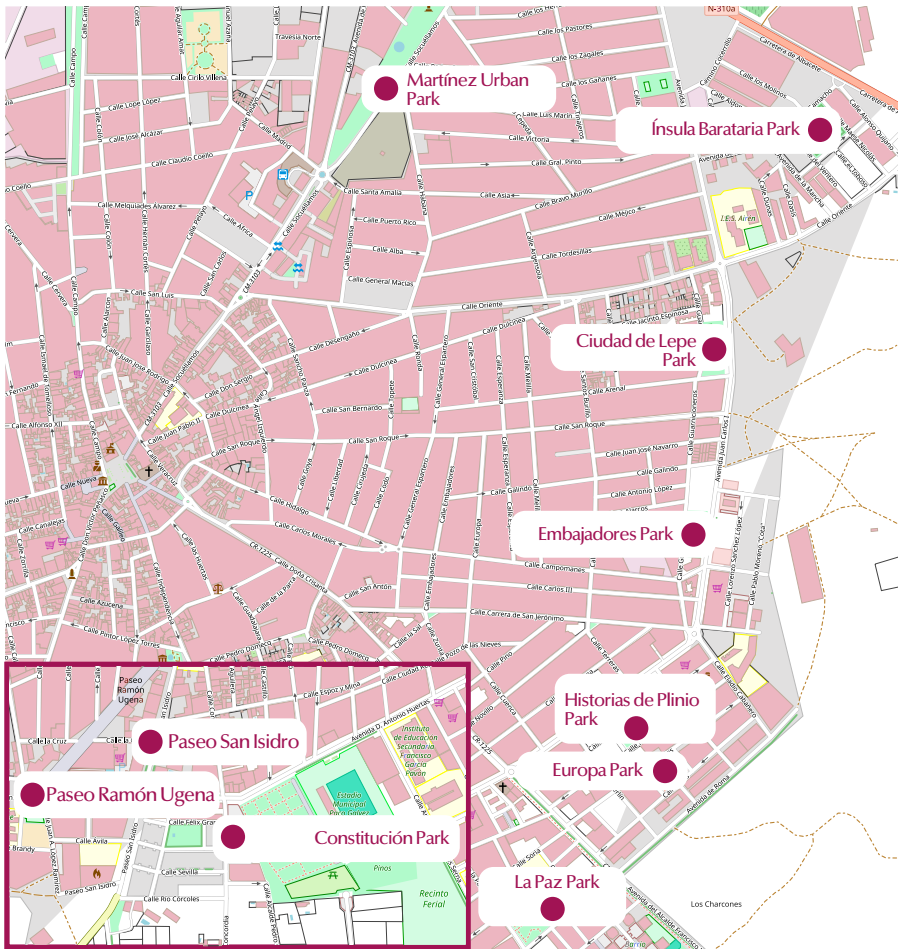
Tips and services

- Use audio guides for parks such as Constitución, Urbano Martínez, **House of Arts and Letters**, and Plinio.
- Wear comfortable footwear and bring water, especially on rural routes.
- Check timetables, guided tours, and audio guides at the Tourist Office.
- Combine nature and culture with visits to museums, wineries, or Plaza de España.
- Respect the environment: do not pick plants, avoid littering and remain quiet in wildlife areas

Suggested itinerary for a green day

- ▶ **Morning**
 - **Tour of Constitución Park and Urbano Martínez Park.**
 - **Picnic under the palm trees.**
 - **Visit to La Paz Park and the House of Arts and Letters.**
- ▶ **Afternoon**
 - **Pinilla Pine Forest Trail (stop at the hermitage).**
 - **Walk along the Bombos Trail.**
 - **Rest in Plinio Park or Embajadores Park.**
 - **Dinner or local food tasting.**
